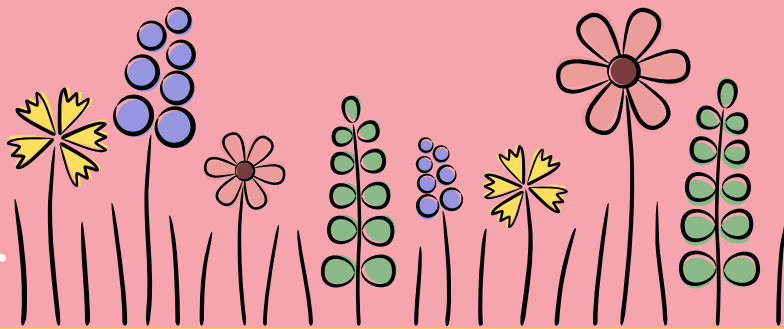

*April 14: Favourite Character Day

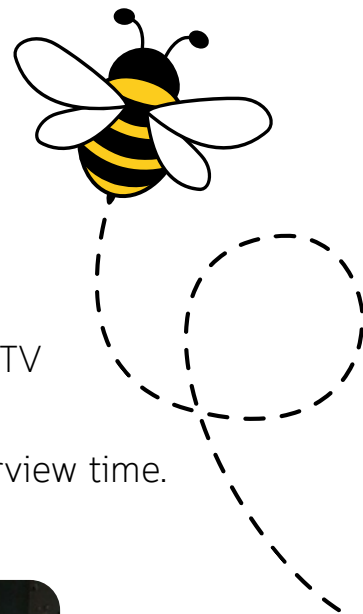
Come dressed as your favourite character from books, movies, and TV

*April 22: Earth Day

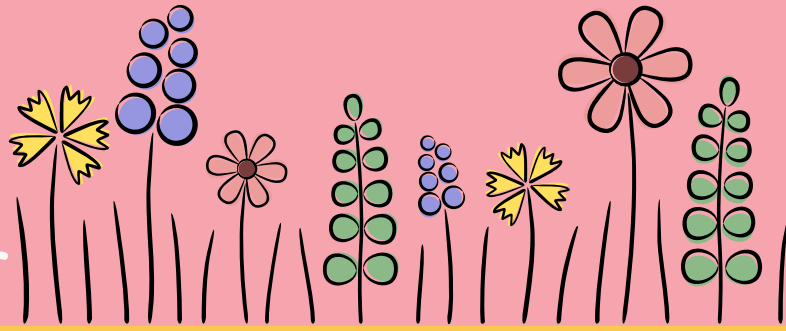
*April 24: Pro-D day (school closed)

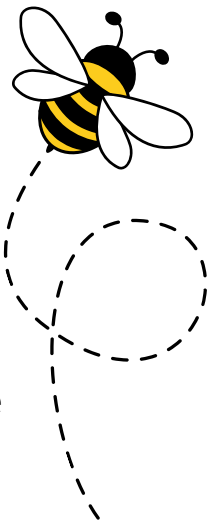

IMPORTANT INFO:

- If you or anyone you know wishes to enroll a student in the Fall (2026) for any grade must do so now. Registration can be completed online or in person.
- Any students who continue to have missing documentation in their registration will be notified. Lists of missing documentation will also be sent home with students for reference.
- Now that the library is up and running, students are encouraged to check at home for any overdue library books. Lists of missing or overdue books will be sent home with students for reference.
- In a continuous effort to improve student safety, all SD27 staff will be receiving additional training on how to recognize worrisome behaviour in students.
