Reflections and Explorations: Highlights from May

Music Class: Kindergarten- Grade 5

Ms. Haley and Ms.Kirshaw's students are exploring a variety of instruments in music class, including the Piano, Ukulele, Hand-Bells, and Xylophone. The grade 4-5 students are also exploring Guitar. Learning to follow rhythm, to read music notes, differentiating instrument categories, and learning to play a variety of songs on different instruments. K-3 Students: Weather and Wildfires

In science class, students have been learning about weather patterns and the role of cultural and prescribed burns in wildfire management. They've gained a deeper understanding of how these controlled burns help maintain forest health and how we can all play a part in preventing wildfires.
